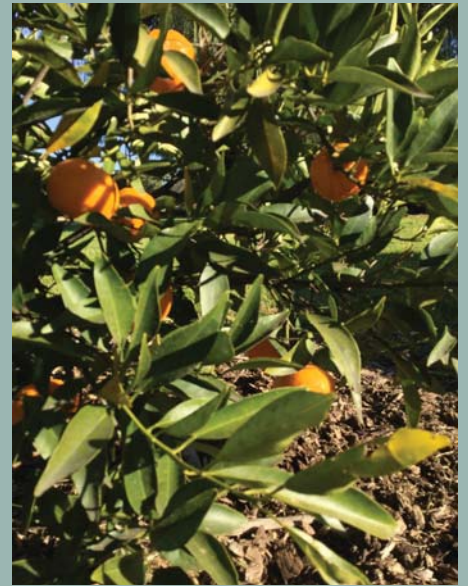

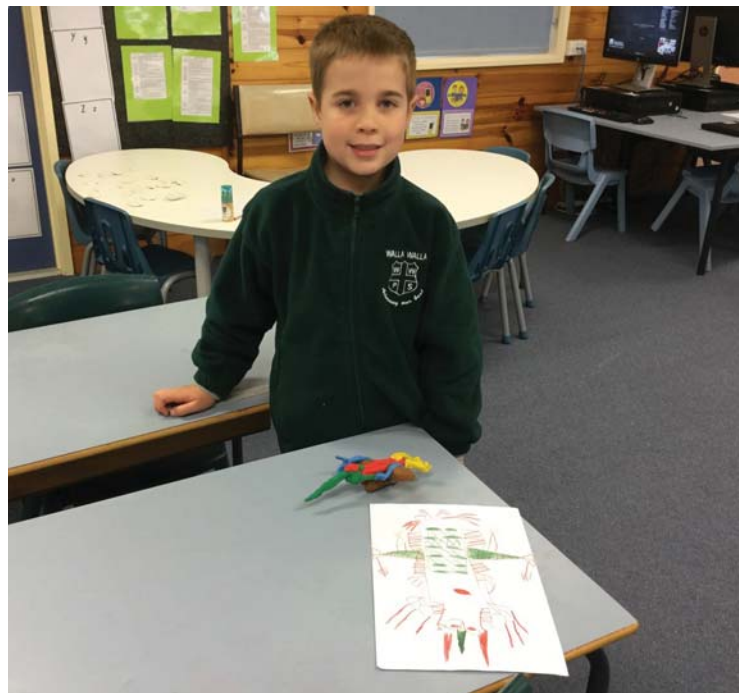

Dinosaur fun for K-2 students

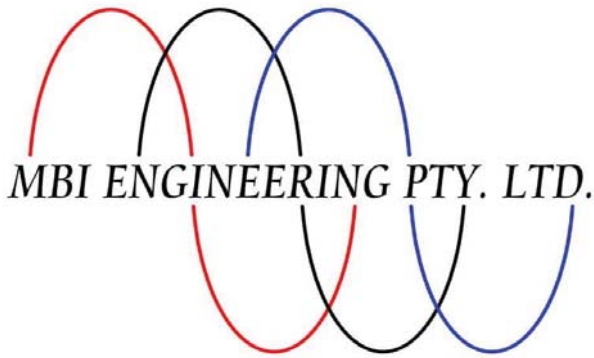
